

- a. Basics of substantive patent law: Focuses on the requirements of patentability, remedies for patent infringement with relevant provisions under the Patents Act, 1970 and brief introduction to substantive patent law in the United States and the EU.
- b. Procedure for filing patent application: Acts as a comprehensive guide for an inventor seeking to register patents under the Patents Act, 1970 and the Patent Co – operation Treaty.

2. Fundamentals of Trademark Law

- a. Basics of trademark law: Focuses on the conditions for registration of a trademark, remedies for trademark infringement with relevant case law and provisions under the Trademark Act, 1999.
- b. Procedure for registration of trademark: Acts as a comprehensive guide for the registration of a trademark under the Trademark Act, 1999 with the relevant forms and the requirements for registration under the Act. Further, registration of trademarks under the Montreal Protocol shall be discussed.

3. Fundamentals of Copyright Law

- a. Basics of Copyright Law: Focuses on the subject matter of copyright, rights accruing from copyright protection, need for registration of copyright, consequences of non – registration and remedies available for the infringement of copyright under the Copyright Act, 1957.

4. Fundamentals of law relating to Geographical indications

- a. Basics of law relating to geographical indications, the advantages of registering geographical indications and examples of geographical indications registration in India. A detailed guide regarding the mode and procedure of registration of GIs in India shall be contained herein.

5. Fundamentals of Law relating to Industrial Designs and Law relating to semiconductor integrated circuits

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- a. A brief introduction to Designs Act, 2000 and the Semiconductor Integrated Circuit and Layout Design Act, 2000
6. An introduction to the International Treaties relating to IPR such as the Agreement on Trade Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS), the Berne Convention, the Patent Co – operation Treaty and the Montreal Protocol.

At the initial stage, we propose to publish 1000 copies of English version and 1000 copies of Hindi version.

(6) Publication of IPR Journal of international standards:

We propose to publish an IPR journal titled "THE INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY & TECHNOLOGY LAW REVIEW". This would be an international journal.


Contents
