Workers find value in fostering cooperative structures

75% of workers expressed high interest in joining cooperative societies that work towards their welfare

Cooperative societies are democratically owned and controlled by workers. At their core, cooperative societies strive for workers' social and economic wellbeing. They are committed to values of care, solidarity, and equity. In the world of exploitative platform work, cooperative societies can provide safeguards through high quality services for worker welfare.

Cooperative societies offer several services to support workers' wellbeing: health, insurance, education support, creche facilities, credit, among others.

TGPWU surveyed 79 workers working for app-based taxi and delivery platforms to understand their perspectives on cooperative societies and different types of unions.


Workers have diverse views on union structures



Across different union structures, **66%** of workers place high importance on union demands that focus on both platforms and governments.

Workers view social protection and negotiation of labour laws and policies as key focus areas across union structures. For demands against platforms, workers view issues of health insurance and deactivation of accounts as key issues.

Putting pressure on the government

Workers find unions tied to another trade union (38%) and independent unions (43%) as most effective

Promoting worker representation and participation

Workers find unions tied to another trade union (41%) and independent unions (43%) as most effective

Whom did TGPWU talk to?

79 workers were surveyed, and 51% were members of TGPWU. They had been engaged in platform work for a median of 5 years. Around half of the workers worked on Uber. Another 20% worked on Ola and 14% worked on Swiggy. Other platforms where workers worked include FlipKart, InDriver, Zomato, and Rapido.

The median age of workers was **35 years,** and **96%** of workers were men. 47% of workers were from Hyderabad. Other prominent districts included: Medchal-Malkajgiri, Ranga Reddy, Suryapet,

Warangal, and Yadadri Bhuvanagiri.

Caste background of workers: OBC (35%); General (29%); SC (18%); ST (6%). Religious background of workers: Hindu (52%); Muslim (39%); Buddhist, Jain, or Christian (9%).
